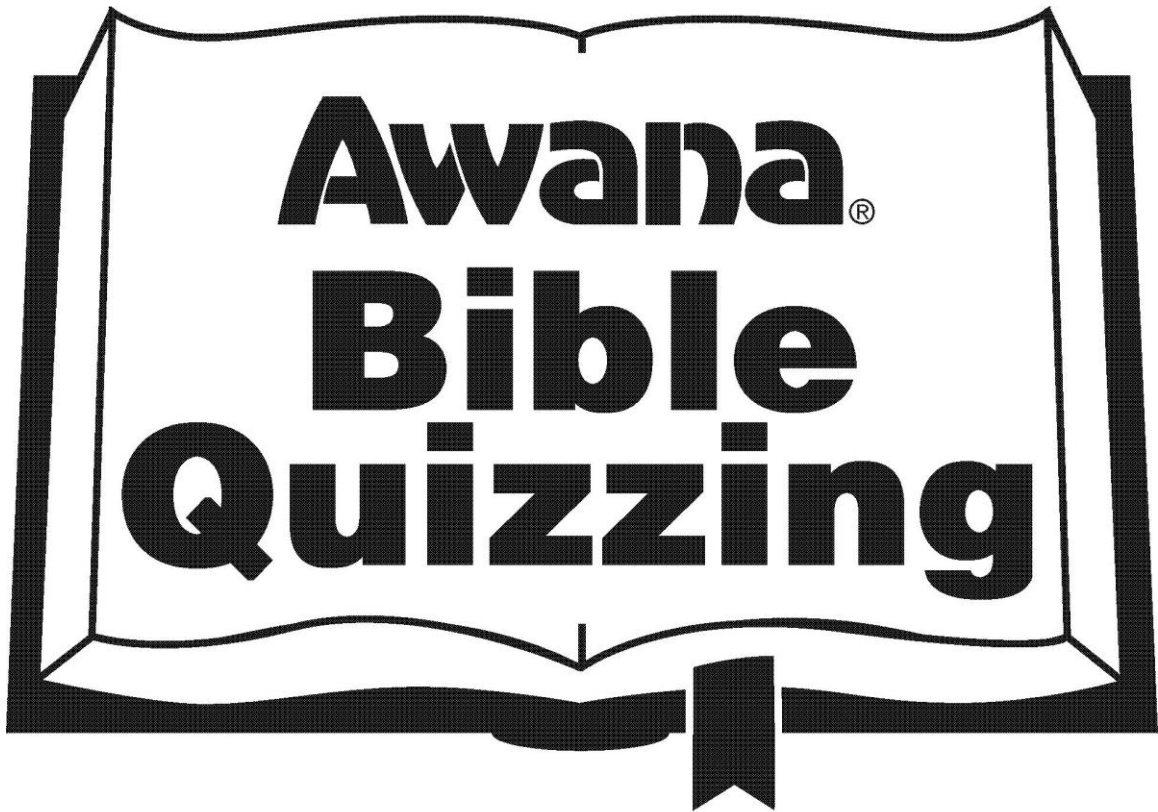


# Awana Bible Quiz 2010



## Quizzing Objectives

- 1 To promote and encourage young people in Bible memorization and review of their Awana handbooks/manuals.
- 2 To provide a competitive atmosphere in which participants can display their Bible knowledge and gain a sense of accomplishment.
- 3 To give young people a greater love for — and working knowledge of — the Bible.
- 4 To proclaim God’s wonderful grace and salvation through Bible quiz questions. Parents and friends may then see their need of becoming a Christian and be challenged to accept Christ as Savior.
- 5 To build quiz leader-participant relationships.

## Quiz Format Overview

Awana Bible Quizzing incorporates at two of the following formats:

- 1 Multiple-choice (paddles)
- 2 Written quizzing (huddle)
- 3 Speed quizzing (buzzers)

Totaled scores from each format are used to determine the winner.

### ***Multiple-choice Quizzing (All Quizzers)***

This segment is also referred to as “Paddles”. The multiple-choice segment allows participants to perform in a low-key competitive atmosphere. Participants from each book are given an opportunity to answer a series of multiple-choice questions using the A-B-C paddles.

### **Rules for Multiple-Choice Quizzing**

- 1 Quizzers from each team by book will be asked a series of multiple-choice questions.
- 2 Questions and possible answers will be read once. There will be three answers to choose from. Quizzers have five seconds to determine their choice of answers. Questions may be read twice if the Quiz Master feels the difficulty of the question warrants it.
- 3 During the reading of the questions, quizzers must look down at their paddles while deciding their answers. Looking any other place is an automatic disqualification from that question.
- 4 When all possible answers have been given, the Quiz Master will say, “Select your answers.” When the five seconds are up, he will call, “Paddles up.”
- 5 During the five-second-answer time, quizzers select the answer they believe to be correct. Then, at the call “Paddles up,” all will raise their answers simultaneously.
- 6 After the “Paddles up” call has been made, no paddle may be exchanged for another paddle.
- 7 If a participant’s paddle is raised late, the participant is disqualified from that question.

- 8 At the “Paddles down” command, participants must lower their paddles.
- 9 Teams are awarded 10 points for each correct answer.
- 10 No points are deducted for incorrect answers.

### ***Team Written Quiz (Book I Quizzers Only)***

This format is also referred to as “Team Huddle”. The huddle quiz segment is a timed segment when participants answer a series of questions.

One or more of the following styles may be used in the written quiz: completion, matching, multiple-choice, finish the verse, and true or false.

### **Rules for Huddle Quizzing**

Two to four quizzers from each book team may participate. In this segment, a series of questions will be asked.

The team is allowed approximately 15 seconds to “get together” quietly and come up with one answer. This answer is then written and held up when called for by the Quiz Master. Each correct answer is worth 20 points. An incorrect answer will result in a 10-point deduction from the team score. A non-answer has a point value of “0.”

**Only a blank slate or everything marked out is a “non-answer.”**

### ***Speed Quizzing (Books II, III and IV Quizzers)***

In the speed quizzing segment clubbers from each book compete against other teams in the same book. There is a series of questions per book. All teams will be read the quiz question. The first team to respond is allowed to answer the question.

### ***Individual Speed Quizzing (Books II, III and IV Quizzers)***

In the speed quizzing segment clubbers from each book compete against other clubbers in the same book. There is a series of questions per book. All teams will be read the quiz question. The first team to respond is allowed to answer the question.

### **Rules for Individual Speed Quizzing**

Two, three or four quizzers from each team may participate. The first quizzer to signal in is acknowledged. The Quiz Master stops at this point and the quizzer is recognized. The quizzer has 10 seconds to begin his/her answer.

## Revised Book IV - NKJV

1. If the first quizzier answers correctly, the value of the question is added to his/her score.
2. If the first quizzier answers incorrectly, the value of the question is deducted from his/her score.
3. If the first quizzier answers incorrectly the Quiz Master will then recognize the quizzier that signaled in second. The Quiz Master will reread the question. The quizzier has five (5) seconds to begin his/her answer and then 30 seconds to complete his/her answer.
4. If correct, the reduced value is added to the quizzier's score.
5. If incorrect, the reduced value is deducted from the quizzier's score.

### Quiz Questions and Answers

1. When a speed question has been answered, the Quiz Master will ask, "**Is that your final answer?**" Only when the quizzier answers "yes," or time runs out, will a question be ruled correct or incorrect with "That is a correct answer," or, "I'm sorry, that is an incorrect answer."
2. Questions asked (other than Scripture quotations) may be answered in the participant's own words, but must be close to what the handbook/manual states. The judges determine whether anything important to the meaning has been left out or altered.
3. If an incorrect answer is given, the Quiz Master will then recognize the quizzier that signals in second. The Quiz Master may reread the question in it's entirety, and then the quizzier has five (5) seconds to begin their answer.
4. If a quiz participant quickly corrects himself or herself in the process of giving their answer, the answer will be accepted.
5. Answers that contain extraneous information may be considered incorrect, even if the correct answer is included.
6. Help from the audience counts as a wrong answer, even if the answer is correct.

### Apparel

Awana emphasizes the importance of modesty, neatness and cleanliness in the apparel worn by both leaders and clubbers of all ages. All participants (including leaders and coaches) must wear an official Awana uniform.

## Quiz Questions and Answers

1. All questions will be taken from the material in the latest edition of the Awana handbooks, manuals and materials. Participants are not expected to interpret the materials.
2. The Awana missionary or event specialist will determine quiz material covered.
3. Questions may be asked on any part of the books assigned, including verses, Bible readings, definitions, etc. (sections, Discoveries, Challenges, lessons).
4. The Quiz Master prefaces each question with the word “question.” No talking is allowed from the word “question” until the answer is given.
5. Should the Quiz Master read a question improperly, the question may be discarded and a new one selected.
6. All Bible verses must be quoted word-perfect according to the latest edition of the Awana handbook. If requested, the quotation must include the complete reference.

## Time-outs

1. No time-outs are allowed.
2. The Quiz Master is the only official who can declare a time-out.

## Coaches

1. Each team is allowed only one official coach during the quiz meet.
2. The team coaches may talk to their teams while the teams rotate for their quiz or during team substitutions

## Appeals

1. Only the official coach may appeal a question or an answer. The coach does this by calling out “question.” The immediate preceding question is the only one that may be appealed by the coach.
2. All appeals are directed to the head judge. When recognized, the coach confers privately with the head judge. After the coach voices the question, the coach must return to his or her seat while a decision is being made.
3. The head judge may consult with quiz judges before making a decision. In all cases, the decisions of the head judge are final.

## Parents Guide

Like most things in life for a child, his/her success in an endeavor (like Bible Quizzing) directly relates to the support of their parents. You can help you child prepare for Bible Quizzing in the following ways.

- 1) Encourage them to study! Each study packet comes with a suggested practice schedule and a practice schedule log for you to sign (see below). We are asking your child to study for at least 20 minutes for 5 days before we have a practice.

- 2) Test your children on what they have studied. The rule book explains how Bible Quizzing works and how your child will be tested. After you child has studied for the 20 minutes, take another 10 minutes to ask some questions. There are many different ways of testing your child:
  - a. Have them give all the answers to a main question (from Book I).
    - Why did God give us the Bible?
      1. So we can know who He is.
      2. So that we can know that He is the one and only true God.
      3. So we can know His words are always true
      4. So we can learn about people from the past.
  - b. Have them recite some verses.
  - c. Have them define some of the definitions provided.
  - d. Have them give answers for the SearchSite materials.
- 3) Give them some practice multiple choice questions to simulate paddle quizzing.
  1. What is the reference for the verse "Your word is truth."?
    - a. Psalm 119:74b
    - b. Psalm 100:3
    - c. John 17:17b**
  2. Jeremiah 10:10a says, "But the Lord is the \_\_\_\_\_ God; He is the living God."

- 4) Review, review, review! We will be practicing for 4 weeks before the actual Bible Quizzing Event. Each practice session will concentrate on a single Discovery/Challenge. When you are testing your child, ask a few questions about a previous section as a review.
- 5) Bring them to every practice. As was mentioned before, we will be practicing a different section every week to help the clubbers before the actual Bible Quizzing competition. The more your child practices, the better he/she will be prepared. We do not simply ask questions during practices, but we actually practice in a competition style so your child can be familiar with what happens during a competition. All clubbers will practice paddle quizzing. Book I clubbers will practice huddle quizzing and Books II through IV will practice team speed quizzing.
- 6) Pray with and for your child.

## SearchSite

### **Challenge 1:4**

*Day #1 – Corinthians 13:1-13*

**OK. You read this chapter about love but what does it have to do with you in the following situations?**

**Dad or Mom say you can't do something you want do to.** Love is kind. I need to listen to them. Love is not selfish. I shouldn't whine about something I'm told to do. I should obey.

**Your little brother or sister hides your soccer shoes and you have ten minutes to get to the park for a game.** Love is patient. Even though my brother (or sister) is wrong, that doesn't mean I have the right to mean back to him (or her).

**You have to visit a relative – the one who always pats you on the head and treats you like you're five.** Again, love isn't selfish. Maybe it isn't the most fun I've ever had, but I can still be kind.

*Day #2 – Titus 2:1-5*

**In verse one, Paul writes that older people are to speak those things that are sound doctrine.**

**In verses 4-5, Paul writes that the older women are to teach the younger women. What are four things they are to teach?**

- To live quietly
- To love their husbands and children
- To be sensible and pure
- To keep their homes and obey their husbands

*Day #3 – Titus 2:6-15*

**In what ways can you show that you are sober-minded (lively wisely or self-controlled) in your everyday life?** By not spending a little too much time watching television or playing video games or playing on the computer, by not losing my temper, by doing homework, etc.

**What do you think “sound speech” is?** By choosing the words the Lord would want me to choose, by being kind, by not “mouthing off”.

### **Challenge 2:3**

*Day #1 – 2 Corinthians 6:14-17, Ephesians 5:1-10*

What is an unbeliever? Someone who has not trusted Christ as a Savior

**When Christians marry unbelievers, they can't share the most important part of their life with their husband or wife. What is the most important part?** Their spiritual life, attending church, their relationship with Christ.

**Verse 16 says Christians are God's temple. A temple is a place where God lives. Who lives within us after we trust Christ as Savior? The Holy Spirit.**

**All these verse have good guidelines for our lives.** In Ephesians 5:1-10, Paul lists several things that are NOT to be part of our life. Define at least three of these things.

- Not being pure
- Wanting what someone else has
- Thinking bad thoughts
- Talking foolishly
- Goofing around in a wrong way
- Hanging around with the wrong kind of friends

**How are we to walk?** In love; as children of light; circumspectly which means very, very carefully; as wise

*Day #2 – Ephesians 5:11-33*

**Submitting means to give way to each other. Who should submit in a marriage (verse 21)?**  
We to submit to one another. Wives submit to their husbands

**How much should husbands love their wives?** As much as Christ loves the church

**How did Christ show His love for the church?** By giving His life for it

*Day #3*

**Find three other verses that talk about marriage. Each verse should be from a different book?**

- Deuteronomy 24:5
- Proverbs 18:22
- Proverbs 19:14
- 1 Timothy 3:2
- Titus 1:6
- 1 Peter 3:7

### **Challenge 3:6**

*Day #1 – 1 Corinthians 1:17-31*

**What did Christ send Paul to do?** To preach the gospel

**What does Paul say about the wisdom of God and the foolishness of men?** Those who don't believe in Christ are foolish. The foolishness of God is wiser than man's wisdom

*Day #2 – Acts 16:16-35*

**Why did the owner turn Paul and Silas over to the authorities?** Because without the girl telling fortunes, the owner wasn't making any money

**Paul and Silas were stripped, beaten and locked up in jail. What did they do?** Prayed and sang praises to God

**Suddenly there was an earthquake that opened the prison doors and loosened the prisoner's chains. But Paul and Silas didn't escape. What did they do?** They stayed where they were. They told the prison keeper not to harm himself because the prisoners hadn't escaped.

**When the jailer asked Paul and Silas how to be saved, what did they say?** That he needed to believe on the Lord Jesus Christ

**If someone asked you how to be saved, what would YOU say?** That you need to understand that you are a sinner and separated from God. God sent His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, to earth to die for our sins. We need to trust Him as our Savior. We need to believe that he died and rose again.

*Day #3 – Romans 15:15-21*

**In a letter to Christians in Rome, Paul said he spoke about one topic wherever he went. What was it?** He preached the gospel, the message of grace.

**Paul said his desire was to share the gospel with people who have not heard of the Christ.**

**Do you know someone in your family, school or neighborhood who not heard the gospel? How can you share the message with that person?** By showing God's love through my actions; by telling them about the Lord Jesus Christ.

#### **Challenge 4:4**

*Day #1 – 1 Corinthians 12:12-27*

**In what verses Paul describes believers as members of what?** As members of the body of Christ

**How many parts of the body are needed?** All the parts

**What happens when one part is hurt or is honored in some special way?** All the parts are hurt or honored

*Day #2 – Romans 12*

**In Romans 12:5-6, which members of the body of Christ are needed to serve and support the church?** All members

**What are three instructions Paul gives Christians?**

## Revised Book IV - NKJV

- Let our love be sincere
- Stay away from things that are evil and stick to those things that are good
- Be kind
- Don't be selfish
- Work hard
- Be excited about the Lord
- Be patient
- Pray
- Give to those in need
- Don't get revenge
- Be at peace with each other

**What do these instructions mean to YOU in your everyday life?** I can be kind to my friends. I can be patient and unselfish. I can work hard, pray for others, give to those who don't have as much as I do, be at peace with others.

*Day #3 – Ephesians 4:7-16*

**God gives every Christian a gift to use for the good of the church (other Christians). Five of those gifts are talked about in verse 11. What are they?**

- Apostles
- Prophets
- Evangelists
- Pastors
- Teachers

**Why does every Christian receive a spiritual gift?** To encourage each other, to do the work of the ministry, etc.

**How does the body of Christ grow and build itself up in love?** Speaking the truth and being a team player doing the work of the Lord.

### **Challenge 5:4**

*Day #1 – 1 Samuel 20:1-17*

**What did Jonathan promise David?** Whatever you want, I will do it for you.

**Jonathan also made a covenant with David's household. Another word for this is promise.**

**How much did Jonathan love David?** He loved him as his own soul

*Day #2 – 1 Samuel 20:18-34*

**Jonathon wanted to help David hide from Jonathan's father, Saul. He told David to hide in a field. Jonathan would signal David to tell him if he was safe from harm or if he needed to get out of there! What signals did Jonathan use?** He would shoot three arrows and then he

would tell a boy to “go, find the arrows”. He would signal David by where he told the boy the arrows had fallen.

**What happened when King Saul found out that Jonathan was loyal to David? How did Jonathan respond?** King Saul was angry. Jonathan also was angry and he refused to eat.

*Day #3 – 1 Samuel 20:35-42*

**What did Jonathan signal David to do?** To get away

**Jonathan and David saw each other only one time after this. What promise did they make before the Lord? Jonathan later died in battle.** That he should go in peace. That they were friends.

**Q: What do I need to know about my family – now and in the future?**

**Challenge 1**

**A:** My family should put the Lord first in everything it does.

**Revelation 4:11** *You are worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honor and power; for You created all things, and by Your will they exist and were created.*

**1 Corinthians 10:31** *Therefore, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God.*

**Joshua 24:15b** Choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether the gods which your fathers served that were on the other side of the River, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you dwell. But as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.

**A:** Family members should enjoy one another.

**Deuteronomy 5:16** Honor your father and your mother, as the Lord your God has commanded you, that your days may be long, and that it may be well with you in the land which the Lord your God is giving you.

**Psalms 127:3** Behold, children are a heritage from the Lord, the fruit of the womb is a reward.

**Colossians 3:17** *And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him.*

**A:** Family members should talk to one another.

**Proverbs 1:8** *My son, hear the instruction of your father, and do not forsake the law of your mother.*

**Proverbs 4:2-4** For I give you good doctrine: do not forsake my law. When I was my father's son, tender and the only one in the sight of my mother. He also taught me, and said to me: "Let your heart retain my words; keep my commands, and live."

**A:** I need to earn my parent's trust.

**Proverbs 27:11** *My son, be wise, and make my heart glad, that I may answer him who reproaches me.*

**Ephesians 6:1-2** Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. "Honor your father and mother," which is the first commandment with promise.

**Q: What do I need to know about my family – now and in the future?**

**Challenge 2**

**A:** Family members have responsibilities.

**Ephesians 6:1-2, 4** Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. “Honor your father and mother,” which is the first commandment with promise. And you, fathers, do not provoke your children to wrath, but bring them up in the training and admonition of the Lord.

**A:** I need to be a kid.

**2 Peter 1:5-7** But also for this very reason, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue, to virtue knowledge. To knowledge self-control, to self-control perseverance, to perseverance godliness. To godliness brotherly kindness, and to brotherly kindness love.

**2 Peter 1:8** *For if these things are yours and abound, you will be neither barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.*

**A:** I need to keep myself pure.

**1 Corinthians 6:19-20** Or do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own? For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God’s.

**A:** I need to pray about God’s plan for my future.

**Jeremiah 29:11** For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, says the Lord, thoughts of peace and not of evil, to give you a future and a hope.

**Philippians 4:12** *I know how to be abased, and I know how to abound. Everywhere and in all things I have learned both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need.*

**Philippians 4:13** I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.

**Q: How can I grow spiritually?**

**Challenge 3**

**A:** I can grow spiritually by learning more about the Bible.

**Hebrews 5:13-14** For everyone who partakes only of milk is unskilled in the word of righteousness, for he is a babe. But solid food belongs to those who are of full age, that is, those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil.

**A:** I can grow spiritually by listening to my pastor.

**Romans 10:17** *So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.*

**2 Timothy 1:13-14** Hold fast the pattern of sound words which you have heard from me, in faith and love which are in Christ Jesus. That good thing which was committed to you, keep by the Holy Spirit who dwells in us.

**A:** I can grow spiritually by memorizing God's Word.

**Colossians 3:16** Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord.

**A:** By being baptized – a picture of my relationship with Christ

**Romans 6:4-5** Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life. For if we have been united together in the likeness of His death, certainly we also shall be in the likeness of His resurrection.

**Romans 6:6** *Knowing this, that our old man was crucified with Him, that the body of sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves of sin.*

**Q: How can I grow spiritually?**

**Challenge 4**

**A:** I can grow spiritually by reading my Bible every day.

**Joshua 1:8** *This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate in it day and night, that you may observe to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good success.*

**Joshua 1:9** Have I not commanded you? Be strong and of good courage; do not be afraid, nor be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go.

**A:** I can grow spiritually by using the gifts God has given me.

**1 Corinthians 12:12** For as the body is one and has many members, but all the members of that one body, being many, are one body, so also is Christ.

**Ephesians 4:16** *From whom the whole body, joined and knit together by what every joint supplies, according to the effective working by which every part does its share, causes growth of the body for the edifying of itself in love.*

**A:** I can grow spiritually by talking to God every day.

**Colossians 4:2** Continue earnestly in prayer, being vigilant in it with thanksgiving.

**James 4:14-15** *Whereas you do not know what will happen tomorrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away. Instead you ought to say, "If the Lord wills, we shall live and do this or that."*

**A:** I can grow spiritually by working together with other Christians at my church.

**1 Corinthians 12:25** That there should be no schism in the body, but that the members should have the same care for one another.

**Psalms 133:1** Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity!

**Q: What is a good friend?**

**Challenge 5**

**A:** A good friend shows respect to others.

**Romans 12:10** Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one another.

**1 Peter 2:17** Honor all people. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the king.

**Matthew 7:12** – *Therefore, whatever you want men to do to you, do also to them, for this is the Law and the Prophets.*

**A:** A good friend shows loyalty to others.

**Proverbs 19:4** - Wealth makes many friends, but the poor is separated from his friend.

**Proverbs 20:6** - Most men will proclaim each his own goodness, but who can find a faithful man?

**Proverbs 19:6** – *Many entreat the favor of the nobility, and every man is a friend to one who gives gifts.*

**A:** A good friend is honest with others.

**Proverbs 12:19** The truthful lip shall be established forever, but a lying tongue is but for a moment.

**Proverbs 19:22** What is desired in a man is kindness, and a poor man is better than a liar.

**Proverbs 12:22** – *Lying lips are an abomination to the Lord, but those who deal truthfully are His delight.*

**A:** A good friend shares and is not selfish.

**1 Peter 1:22** Since you have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the spirit in sincere love of the brethren, love one another fervently with a pure heart.

**Psalm 133:1** Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity!
